Admissions

Enrollment. Discovery Diving Co., Inc. accepts Enrollment until the program is full. Enrollment is limited to eight students per calendar session for each program. All water work training is limited to standards established by certifying agencies. Instructor and Classroom sessions are typically less than 16. Students must enroll at least one week before the start of a course. Students can enroll in a program by contacting Discovery Diving Co., Inc. via phone: (252) 728-2265 or email: dive@discoverydiving.com.

Students must complete and sign an Enrollment Agreement, a Standard Safe Diving Practices Statement of Understanding, and a Liability Release and Assumption of Risk Agreement. All students complete an admissions interview with a DSO.

We comply with American with Disabilities Act (ADA) regulations and accommodate special needs students who meet certifying agency standards.

In compliance with federal laws and regulations, Discovery Diving Co., Inc. does not discriminate based on race, creed, color, religion, gender, age, national origin, disability, protected veteran status, genetic information, sexual orientation, gender identity, or any other status protected by federal, state, or local law in any of its policies, procedures, or practices. An Equal Opportunity institution, Discovery Diving Co., Inc., does not discriminate in the recruitment and admission of students, the recruitment and employment of faculty and staff, or the operations of any programs and activities.

Enrollment Agreement. Contracts for payment of tuition, fees, and all other charges are in the Enrollment Agreement. Payment of tuition and fees is due no later than two weeks before the start of the term or at the time of your registration to ensure your spot in the class. Only payment in full finalizes your registration; we call it confirmation.

Professional Program Entrance Requirements

- The student must be at least 18 years of age or older.
- Students must be in good physical condition and have a PADI Medical Exam signed by a medical doctor asserting their fitness to dive.
- Students must be able to swim 400-yards without stopping
- Students must be able to tread water or float for 10 minutes.
- Students entering this program without any initial training must provide an Official Transcript from all schools attended, including HIGH SCHOOL.
- Students transferring into the program with previous training must provide transcripts from all colleges attended and documentation of previous Scuba Diving Training.
- Students re-admitted to the program must provide official transcripts from institutions they have attended while on leave from a Discovery Diving Co., Inc. program.
- Students must demonstrate the ability to read, write, and communicate.

Specific Course Requirements

Open Water Scuba Diver

- Complete a 200-yard swim with any combination of strokes
- 10-minute float, 5-minute treading water, and Breath-hold swim
- Purchase and read the PADI Open Water Manual with tables
- Complete the knowledge reviews at the end of the chapter. The first three chapters before the first-class meeting.
- The minimum age for enrollment is 10

Advanced Open Water

- PADI Open Water Diver certification or equivalent certification.
- The minimum age for enrollment is 12
- Students must purchase the PADI Advanced Open Water manual
- Purchase special equipment identified by the instructor
- Complete the knowledge reviews for chapters assigned by the instructor

Specialty Courses

- PADI Open Water Diver certification or equivalent certification.
- Each specialty has a minimum age requirement
- Students must purchase the PADI Specialty manual
- Purchase special equipment identified by the instructor
- Complete the knowledge reviews at the end of the manual

Rescue Diver Course

- PADI Advanced Open Water diver or equivalent certification
- The minimum age for enrollment is 12
- Complete the Emergency First Response Course or First Aid and CPR within 24 months before the start of the class
- Students must purchase the PADI Rescue manual
- Purchase special equipment identified by the instructor
- Complete the knowledge reviews at the end of each chapter

Dive Master Course

- PADI Rescue Diver certification
- The minimum age is 18
- At least 40 logged dives to start
- At least 60 logged dives before certification
- Students must purchase the PADI Divemaster manual
- Purchase special equipment identified by the instructor
- Complete the knowledge reviews at the end of each chapter

Open Water Scuba Instructor (OWSI)Course

- PADI Divemaster or Assistant Instructor certification or equivalent
- The minimum age is 18
- At least 100 logged dives before certification
- Purchase special equipment identified by the instructor
- Complete the Instructor Development Course (IDC) and Instructor Evaluation (IE)

Transfer Credit. Students may receive credit for previous certifications and training. All post-secondary transcripts will be evaluated for applicable transfer credit. Students must provide documentation of previous certification and training to Discovery Diving Co., Inc. prior to enrollment. Transcripts or a record of certification from PADI are required for transfer credit consideration. No additional fees are required for requesting transfer credit.

<u>Acceptable Transfer Credit</u>. Discovery Diving Co., Inc. does not limit the amount of credit accepted for transfer. However, only PADI certifications completed within six months of enrollment are considered for transfer credit. A minimum grade or grade point average is not required. Discovery Diving Co., Inc. does not allow credit through examination.

Transfer Credit Awarded. Transfer credit awarded is balanced between the benefit to the student and maintaining the integrity and standards of the institution. Applicable credit or lack thereof will be noted in the student's academic record. For transfer credit accepted, the duration of training is reduced. Accordingly, a written notice of the credit is supplied to the student. An appropriate adjustment will be made in tuition and fees corresponding to the acceptance of transfer credit for any program of instruction.

<u>Appeals</u>. Students may appeal the award of transfer credit in writing to the Owner/PDSO/Director within 30 days of receiving a written notice of the award of credit or lack thereof. Discovery Diving Co., Inc does not consider any appeals after 30 days.

<u>Request to withdraw</u>. A student may request to withdraw from any program via a school official.

Student Services

The faculty and staff at Discovery Diving Co., Inc. are dedicated to providing all students with comprehensive student services. These resources contribute to the quality of each student's overall experience. We strive for continuous improvement that extends through a culture of caring with the highest professional standards.

Student Requirements

- Purchase the required manual for the course attending.
- Read the chapters and complete the Knowledge Reviews at the end of each chapter.
- Complete the PADI Medical Form available on the website and get it signed off by a doctor before the beginning of class.
- Purchase a Scuba mask, fins, booties, and snorkel. Discovery Diving Co., staff are available by appointment for a personal fitting before the first day of class. Discovery Diving Co., Inc provides the remaining equipment for all Open Water class, pool, and ocean sessions.
- Professional program students are expected to purchase all required scuba equipment by the end of term 3 for Divemaster and Instructor. Students in all other professional programs are expected to start the program with all required scuba equipment.
- Note class times and dates.
- Practice putting your face in the water in a bathtub, pool, etc., and practice being able to exhale through your nose 2 or 3 times on one breath without lifting your face out of the water.
- Be able to swim 400 yards continuously in under 10 minutes.

Course Location

- Orientation and lectures are held at Discovery Diving, 414 Orange Street, in Beaufort. Classrooms are located upstairs above the Dive Shop and at the annex, 407 Turner St.
- During the summer, we use local pools, including Cherry Point Marine Corps Air Station, Camp Albemarle
- Open Water Training Dives are completed in the ocean at the Radio Island Rock Jetti.
- As part of the Open Water Class, we offer an introduction to wreck diving on one of the fabulous inshore wrecks located just off the coast. Additionally, many of the training dives are conducted at these same wrecks.

<u>Student Records</u>. Discovery Diving Co., Inc. guarantees the student's right to access their records and release information about an individual student per the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA).

<u>Academic Advisement</u>. Students receive orientation during the admission interview and again at the end of the second week of all professional programs. Students receive academic guidance throughout program enrollment from school officials and senior faculty. The guidance includes advising students of Discovery Diving Co., Inc. policies, regulations, and procedures. This guidance also includes, but is not limited to:

- Discussing professional programs to ensure students understand what
- each program offers
- Discussing possible credit transferability for incoming students
- Understanding the assessment of required foundational knowledge
- Providing information about course and program prerequisite
- requirements
- Supporting students with information related to enrollment, course
- materials, financial assistance, and payment requirements
- Discussing class attendance expectations
- General student support
- As a student progresses through the program, they are counseled on their strengths and weaknesses in all areas of instruction.

A student's primary points of contact are the Designated School Officials. Students can contact them in person or via email. Students can expect a response from a school official within 72 hours for all inquiries.

Emergency Medical /EMS. In the event a student requires medical attention, whether injured or becoming ill within Discovery Diving Co., Inc. spaces, the student should contact their personal physician immediately. If it is necessary to be seen by a doctor or go to the hospital, a family member will be called to transport them to the appropriate facility. If an emergency arises requiring Emergency Medical Services to evaluate the injury/illness of a student on-site, the student is responsible for any transportation charges. Furthermore, Discovery Diving Co., Inc. employees will not be responsible for the transportation of the student due to liabilities that may occur. In addition, a physician's "return to work" notice may be required. Health coverage is not provided to students.

COVID-19 protocol

Students with COVID symptoms, as defined by the Centers for Disease Control (CDC), should contact Discovery Diving Co., Inc for instructions before showing up for their assigned class.

If it is determined, exposure to COVID-19 occurs in the Discovery Diving Co., Inc. facilities. The Owner/PDSO or a DSO shall ensure compliance with the guidelines for businesses and employers responding to COVID-19.

Student Conduct. Students are required to perform to the best of their ability, respect their peers and the instructors, and act and dress professionally. Any violation of these will receive a warning. If continued abuse occurs, the student may be dismissed from the program without a refund. Students are expected to conduct themselves with courtesy, promptness, preparedness, enthusiasm, and cooperation. Dismissal for unsatisfactory conduct is made if a student's behavior disrupts the learning environment, thus interfering with other students' learning or negatively affecting safety. Dismissal may also occur if a student's behavior creates an unfavorable impression in the community about the school.

The use of illegal drugs is cause for immediate dismissal. The use of prescription drugs or alcohol affecting the student's behavior during class is cause for probation. A second incident may result in dismissal.

<u>**Career Placement</u>**. Students have access to Discovery Diving Co., Inc. computers for online searching of possible job opportunities. PADI maintains a website of current job openings. Additionally, periodic job announcements are forwarded to students via email. We do not guarantee employment, but we do our best to give our students every job opportunity that we discover.</u>

Student Grievance

Discovery Diving Co., Inc.'s policy is to administer its programs in a fair, equitable, academically sound manner and per the appropriate regulations and criteria established by school officials, accrediting associations, and federal and state laws and regulations. To this end, students are provided an opportunity to express any complaints, grievances, or disputes.

Students are encouraged to address any issues with the faculty or staff member for which the grievance is based. If unresolved, the student can file a grievance with the school officials. Grievances should be filed in writing within five business days of the incident. School officials will review the grievance and take appropriate action. A school official will communicate their decision to the student. A timely resolution of student grievances is a top priority of Discovery Diving Co., Inc. School officials will strive to resolve a student grievance within 30 days of receipt.

Students will not be subject to adverse action by Discovery Diving Co., Inc. due to filing a grievance.

Housing. Discovery Diving Co., Inc. maintains two dive lodges, and students may stay in these lodges at a reduced rate.

<u>**Computer Access**</u>. Discover Diving Co., Inc. does not supply computers to students. However, students can use a Discovery Diving Co., Inc. office computer for career placement and class projects with advance notice. Students can schedule the use of a computer. All campus classrooms and office spaces are equipped with WIFI.

Official Transcript. Students can request a copy of their official transcript via email to a DSO. Students must ensure their request includes their name, name address and phone number. Additionally, students must provide the name and address of the institution or person where they would like the transcript sent. There is no cost for an official transcript. A DSO is available to address any questions a transferring institution may have about the student or courses complete.

Academics

The faculty and staff at Discovery Diving Co., Inc. provide all students with comprehensive academic services. These resources are geared toward addressing specific academic needs and contribute to the quality of each student's overall experience. We strive for continuous improvement through a culture of caring with the highest educational practices.

<u>Unit of Credit</u>. Discovery Diving Co., Inc. uses clock hours as the unit of credit for all programs/courses.

Grading System

Discovery Diving Co., Inc. uses a 5-point scale with reference to a 0-100% scale for written exams and quizzes.

Students complete knowledge reviews throughout the course, highlighting the important topics covered during a particular course. Quizzes may be used to test the retention of important material, and a final exam that covers all material covered may also be used.

Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP)

Discovery Diving Co., Inc. professional programs have varying requirements for clock hours. Refer to the Professional Programs section of this catalog starting on page ## for total clock hours for each program. SAP is evaluated in terms 2 and 4 or when a student is scheduled to complete 30% and 70% of a professional program. Students enrolled in professional programs must complete 22 clock hours per week.

- Students are required to make quantitative progress toward program completion. To be making satisfactory academic progress, a student must attend at least 80% of the scheduled class hours on a cumulative basis during each evaluation period.
- The student must maintain an overall 3 point or higher average except where outside certifying agencies require a higher score.
- Students must complete all knowledge development and practical skill demonstrations.
- Students are required to earn an 80% on all quizzes and exams except where outside certifying agencies require a higher score.
- If a student fails to complete all knowledge development and practical skill demonstrates, they do not earn a certification in a particular course or program.

Incomplete grades are not given, and students must repeat any classes, knowledge development, workshop, or practical application in which they earn less than a 3. Coursework repeated may

adversely affect a student's academic progress in terms of the maximum time frame. Students who withdraw from the program will receive a grade of 0% in each class interrupted by the withdrawal. All interrupted classes must be repeated upon readmission to the institution.

Probation

If a student fails to meet the cumulative 80% attendance or 3-point grade average for any evaluation period, or both, may be placed on probation for the next evaluation period. Additionally, failing written exams, untimely submission of coursework are causes for probation. The student is eligible for G.I. Bill benefits while on probation. Failure to achieve an 80% attendance or a 3-point grade average, or both, at the end of the probation period is cause for administrative withdrawal of the student. Students will be notified in writing when they are placed on probation and the steps necessary to be removed from probation. Students will also receive attendance or academic counseling, from a DSO, as appropriate, when they are placed on Probation. The institution will provide written notification to a student if they are being administratively withdrawn for unsatisfactory academic progress.

Appeal Process

The student may submit a written appeal of their dismissal within five calendar days of their receipt of the dismissal notice. The appeal must be accompanied by documentation of the mitigating circumstances that have prevented the student from attaining satisfactory academic progress and evidence that changes have occurred to allow the student to now meet standards of satisfactory academic progress. The student may be allowed to attend another scheduled program, assuming a reasonable chance for success. Reinstatement approval must come from a school official after a complete evaluation and interview with the student.

<u>Reinstatement</u>. Students reinstated upon appeal are on a probationary status for the next evaluation period, during which time they must meet the terms and conditions set out in the letter granting reinstatement. At the end of the evaluation period, and at the end of every evaluation period thereafter, the student's academic status will be reviewed. The student may continue probation if they meet the terms of the academic plan approved at the time the student was reinstated, until such time as satisfactory academic progress status is regained.

<u>Graduation Requirements</u>. Students are required to complete all components of their program for graduation. OWSI students must complete all requirements up to the Instructor Evaluation (IE).

<u>Maximum Time Frame</u>. All program requirements must be completed within one year of a student starting the program. Refer to the Professional Certification Programs section of this catalog for program start dates and length. Time spent on an approved leave of absence is not counted against the maximum time frame. Students exceeding the maximum time frame will be administratively withdrawn.

<u>Attendance</u>. Regular attendance and punctuality are expected for every hour of all courses. Student physical attendance is required for classroom-based face-to-face instruction, pool sessions, and open water training.

For VA-funded programs at the end of each "reporting period," student attendance (clockhours/week) of less than 22 hours for any week, i.e., not maintaining full time, is reported for the calendar week (s) in question, Sunday through Saturday. This change in training time affects the benefit amount (tuition/fees, housing allowance).

Legal Holiday. Due to the nature of this profession, we are often conducting classes or dive training trips during holidays. We work with the students to give them the Professional Program classes they need on time, and if a class is scheduled on a legal holiday, we will execute the class on that holiday with the following exceptions. Discovery Diving Co., Inc. is closed on Christmas and New Years Day. Discovery Diving Co., Inc. closes at 5 pm on Thanksgiving and New Year's Eve.

Excused Absence. Students can request an absence via email from a school official. Students are responsible for scheduling the makeup of missed hours, classroom-based face-to-face instruction, pool sessions, or open water training. Students may incur an additional charge of \$20/hr. for makeup work. All course work must be completed before certification is granted.

<u>Unexcused Absence</u>. If a student has an unexcused absence, they are required to make up the missed hours, classroom-based face-to-face instruction, pool sessions, or open water training. This must be arranged through a school official and may incur an additional fee of \$20/hr. If a student has one unexcused absence, the student may be placed on probation. All course work must be completed before certification is granted.

Tardiness. For every 15 minutes late, students will receive a point. The accumulation of 10 points is an unexcused absence. Late arrival or departure for any hour is considered one full hour of absence.

Leave of Absence. Students can request a leave of absence in writing to a school official. An absence constituting more than 5% of the program requires enrollment in the next scheduled session.

<u>Certifying Agencies</u>. Discovery Diving Co., Inc. uses the curriculum provided by the Professional Association of diving Instructors (PADI) and the Divers Alert Network (DAN). Certification cards are issued when students complete the requirements for a class.

PADI is the world's largest diving training organization, with offices, instructors, and retail dive centers in more than 90 countries.

DAN is a group of not-for-profit organizations dedicated to improving diving safety for all divers. It was founded in Durham, North Carolina, in 1980 at Duke University.

Equipment

All equipment necessary for Scuba diving and completing classes are available for purchase. Students are required to purchase masks, fins, snorkels, and dive boots before PADI 100. All other required equipment is provided for the open water diver course. Professional program students are expected to purchase their own personal/professional equipment in installments to have a complete set by the end of term 3 for Divemaster and Instructor.

Facilities

<u>**Classroom.**</u> Discovery Diving Co., Inc. is a two-story facility located in Beaufort, NC, with an additional teaching annex. All equipment required for Scuba diving, either for rent or purchase, is available on the first floor of the facilities. The second floor of the facilities represents the main classroom area, which includes white board, TV/DVD, and learning material. In addition, the second floor of the facility houses the repair station and main office. The teaching annex offers three separate classrooms and access to administrative offices. The classrooms are located at 414 Orange St. and 407 Turner St., Beaufort, NC 28516. The classroom phone number is 252-728-2265

<u>**Training Sites</u>**. Discovery Diving Co., Inc. uses the local pools for confined water training and the ocean for open water training. As part of the Open Water Class, we also introduce wreck diving on one of the fabulous inshore wrecks located just off the coast. Many of the training dives are conducted at these same wrecks.</u>

- Cherry Point Marine Corps Air Station pool is located at bldg 289 E St. MCAS Cherry Point 28533. The pool site phone number is 252-466-2209

- Radio Island Rock Jetti is located at 101 Olde Towne Yacht Club Dr, Beaufort, NC 28516. The Radio Island Rock Jetti does not have a phone number. However, faculty use their cell phones when conducting training at this site.
- Charter boats operate in the open ocean without a fixed address or phone number. The charter boats have radios for communication.

Financial Services

Deposits. A deposit is required upon registration for a course.

<u>Registration</u>. Discovery Diving Co., Inc. charges a \$100 registration fee for all programs to cover administrative costs.

Fees

Fees include the charter boat costs required for offshore dives.

- Charter boat fees
 - \$75 half-day
 - \$135 Full day

Fees also include processing and administration charges, small boat use, lab fees, and pool use fees. There are no student activities fees.

Tuition. Payment in full or payment arrangements are required on or before the session start date of each class or program. The equipment costs are considered tools of the trade and are required for all program students when they take PADI 451, PADI 500, PADI 601.

<u>Tuition Collection</u>. Students are not allowed to attend any portion of a program, or course if they have not paid for it. Discovery Diving Co., Inc. may collect up to 50 percent of the total tuition before the mid-point of the program. The remainder of the tuition may be collected when the student has completed one-half of the program. Federal regulations regarding the disbursement of tuition supersede state disbursement regulations. Discovery Diving Co., Inc. accepts Cash, Credit Cards, Debit Cards, and personal checks.

Books, Supplies, and Equipment

The following is a list of prices for manuals and required course equipment. Students are required to purchase the books from Discovery Diving from PADI 500 Divemaster onwards to PADI 730 Instructor Exam. Students enrolled in a program must have all required equipment by the start of week 16.

Payment Plan

\$1,450 per month for the Scuba Divemaster Program for Elite Professionals program and \$2,200 per month for the Scuba Instructor Program for Elite Professionals can be arranged.

Scholarships. No scholarships are available.

Department of Veteran Administration (VA) Funding

The Discovery Diving Co., Inc. offers programs approved by the appropriate State Approving Agency to enroll persons eligible to receive education benefits from the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA).

Students must be admitted into an approved program to be eligible to receive benefits. Admission procedures for veterans and other eligible persons are the same as those for other students. Students requesting VA benefits must complete VA Form 1990.

Students may receive education benefits only for courses that are required for their designated program. Students who receive VA benefits are subject to strict academic regulations and should know how their actions may affect their eligibility to receive benefits.

Refund Policy

Students are entitled to a refund if they withdraw or cancel their request for enrollment. Refunds are calculated using North Carolina state statutes and ACCET refund policies. Whichever amount benefits the student is returned to the student. The following definitions and policies apply to student refunds.

<u>Administrative Fee</u>. Discovery Diving Co., Inc. retains an administrative fee associated with withdrawal or termination of \$100.00

<u>Rejection of Applicant</u>. If an applicant is rejected for enrollment or a prospective international student has their visa application rejected, a full refund of all tuition monies paid will be made to the applicant.

Cancellation/Withdraw

<u>Program Cancellation</u>. If Discovery Diving Co., Inc. cancels a program after a student's enrollment, the institution will refund all monies paid by the student.

Before the Start of Class. If an applicant accepted by Discovery Diving Co., Inc. cancels before the start of scheduled classes or never attends class (no-show), the institution will refund all monies paid, less a maximum application/registration fee of \$100 as noted on the enrollment agreement. Discovery Diving Co., Inc. may retain any housing costs incurred.

<u>After the Start of Class</u>. Discovery Diving Co., Inc. uses the following criteria to calculate a refund after the class has started. Whichever amount benefits the student is returned to the student.

- When determining the number of weeks completed by the student, Discovery Diving C., Inc. considers a partial week the same as if a whole week is completed, provided the student was present at least one day during the scheduled week.
- During the first week of classes, tuition charges withheld will not exceed 10 percent (10%) of the stated tuition up to a maximum of \$1,000 or if a student withdraws before completing 25% of any class. The student receives a 75% refund.

- If a student voluntarily withdraws from any class after completing at least 25% of that class. The student receives no refund or after the first week and through fifty percent (50%) of the period of financial obligation, tuition charges retained will not exceed a prorate portion of tuition for the training period completed, plus ten percent (10%) of the unearned tuition for the period of training that was not completed.
- After fifty percent (50%) of the period of financial obligation is completed, Discovery Diving Co., Inc. retains the full tuition.

Discovery Diving Co., Inc. will have 45 days after withdrawal, cancellation, or termination to pay any refund due. The 45 days is calculated from the first scheduled class or from the notice of withdrawal whichever occurs first.

<u>Unable to Continue Operations</u>. The institution has and maintains the following policy about continuing current educational classes. If the institution, for any reason, is unable to continue operating as an educational entity, sufficient funds are available to refund tuition and fees for currently enrolled classes and the refund of any unearned tuition and fees for educational programs (pre-paid tuition and fees) that cannot be completed through the awarding of certificates and certifications.

ACE has set forth the following college credit recommendations for PADI courses.

Individual Class Descriptions

PADI 100 Series

PADI 100 - PADI Open Water Diver

The PADI Open Water course is designed to provide the student with the basic knowledge and skills to safely gain limited experience in the diving environment under favorable conditions. We recommend that the newly qualified Scuba diver limit diving to calm, shallow waters with an experienced buddy and engage in special diving activities only after qualifying through training. Training categories include diving equipment, medical aspects, diving physics, diving environment, dive tables, diving practices, diving activities, and Scuba diving skills. The class culminates with four beach entry Scuba dives. We include two boat dives to the Indra for extra experience on a charter boat and diving on a wreck. **Requirements:**

- Complete a swim evaluation of 200yard swim, 10-minute float, 5-minute tread, breath-hold swim.
- 2) Satisfactorily pass a written examination.
- 3) Supply mask, fins, snorkel,
- 4) PADI Open Water Manual with tables and Diver logbook.

Minimum Age: 15; Students 10 to 14 years old receive a Junior Open Water Certification.

PADI 110 – Boat Diving Course

This course is designed to acquaint divers with the aspects of boat diving, including terminology, layout, storage areas, off-limit areas, location of emergency equipment, boarding/debarking techniques, water entry and exit techniques, and general in-water dive procedures. Prerequisites: PADI 100 or equivalent training. Minimum Age: 12

PADI 111 - Underwater Navigator

The PADI Underwater Navigator course is designed to familiarize the diver with the enjoyment of underwater navigation. Prerequisites: PADI 100 or equivalent training. Minimum Age: 12

PADI 112 - Dry Suit Diver

This course is designed to provide the student an understanding of diving in dry suits and help the student develop the skills, knowledge, and techniques necessary for dry suit diving.

Prerequisites: PADI 100 or equivalent training. Minimum Age: 12

PADI 113 – Diver Propulsion Vehicle

The PADI Diver Propulsion Vehicle course is designed to familiarize the diver with the enjoyment of underwater diving with a propulsion vehicle. Prerequisites: PADI 100 or equivalent training. Minimum Age: 12

PADI 114 - Full Face Mask Diver

The PADI Full Face course is designed to educate divers about using Full-Face Masks, emphasizing the AGA Mask and the Ocean Reef Masks. This program will introduce the participants to Full Face Masks and underwater communication equipment. Prerequisites: PADI 100 or equivalent training. Minimum Age: 15

PADI 115 - Underwater Naturalist

The PADI Underwater Naturalist course is designed to introduce the underwater aquatic environment and help the student diver develop safe and responsible interaction with aquatic life. Prerequisites: PADI 100 or equivalent training. Minimum Age: 12

PADI 116 – Drift Diver

The PADI Drift Diver course is designed to familiarize the diver with the enjoyment of diving while using the currents to drift dive. Prerequisites: PADI 100 or equivalent training. Minimum Age: 12

PADI 117 – Aquarium Collecting

This course is designed to give the diver the necessary skills and knowledge for establishing and maintaining Saltwater aquariums. Prerequisites: PADI 100 or equivalent training. Minimum Age: 12

PADI 118 - Night Diver

The PADI Night Diver course is designed to prepare the diver to dive safely at night. Prerequisites: PADI 100 or equivalent training. Minimum Age: 12

PADI 119 – Digital Underwater Photography

This course covers basic underwater digital photography with special emphasis on practical photographic techniques, covering such subjects as, available light, flash photography, camera handling, composition, photographic principles and care and maintenance of equipment. Prerequisites: PADI 100 or equivalent training. Minimum Age: 12

PADI 120 – AWARE Fish Identification

The PADI AWARE Fish Identification course is designed to give the diver adequate knowledge to identify North Carolina tropical reef fish correctly, temperate water fish, as well as some of the more frequently encountered Caribbean reef fish. Prerequisites: PADI 100 or equivalent training. Minimum Age: 12

PADI 121 - Peak Performance Buoyancy

The PADI Peak Performance Buoyancy course will enhance the diver's buoyancy control ability through knowledge development and practical skills. By the end of the course, you will be able to run through a buoyancy course successfully. Prerequisites: PADI 100 or equivalent training. Minimum Age: 12

PADI 200 Series

PADI 200 - Advanced Open Water Diver

The PADI Advanced Open Water Diver course is designed to enhance the diver's experience, skill, and knowledge for practical application in the diving environment. This course is a prerequisite for the Rescue Diver, Dive Master, and Master Diver courses. Prerequisites: PADI 100 or equivalent training. Minimum Age: 15, Students 12 to 14 years old receive a Junior Advanced Open Water Certification.

PADI 210 - Enriched Air (EANx) Diver

This course is designed to give the necessary skills and knowledge for diving with Enriched Air Nitrox. The course consists of four hours of lectures and classroom exercises. The student will develop a working knowledge of Enriched Air Nitrox, physiological aspects of breathing oxygen at elevated partial pressures, computation of equivalent air depths, use of dive tables, oxygen analysis, dive planning, and special equipment requirements. Prerequisites: PADI 100 or equivalent training. Minimum Age: 15

PADI 220 Equipment Specialist

The PADI Equipment Specialist course is designed to introduce new types of equipment and familiarize divers with the operation and maintenance of equipment. Prerequisites: PADI 100 or equivalent training. Minimum Age: 12

PADI 230 – Lion Fish – Spearfishing

The PADI Underwater Hunter course is centered on hunting with spear guns and pole spears. The course will also be used to develop the required knowledge and skills for underwater collecting items such as shells, artifacts, or tropical fish. Prerequisites: PADI 200 or equivalent training. Minimum Age: 15

PADI 240 – Narcosis Management

This course is offered through PSAI. This course will have you perform underwater skills that relate to the real world of diving: Keeping up with Depth, Air, Time, and Awareness (DATA). You must be comfortable and competent with the mental and motor skills at each training depth before training to the next level. Level 1 (100 ft); Level 2 (130 ft); Level 3 (150 ft). Prerequisites: PADI 200 Advanced Open Water Diver of equivalent and DAN Master Insurance or higher. Minimum Age: 15 for Level 1 and 2; 18 for Level 3.

PADI 250 - Shark Awareness

The PADI Shark Awareness course is designed to educate the diver about sharks, with emphasis on the Atlantic Sand Tiger. This course will also give an understanding into the true nature of sharks and dispel any preconceived notion about sharks. Prerequisites: PADI 200 or equivalent training. Minimum Age: 15

PADI 300 Series

PADI 300 - Rescue Diver

The PADI Rescue Diver course is designed to develop individuals' necessary knowledge and skills to perform diver rescues effectively and assist, manage diving accident situations, render proper first aid, and qualify for PADI Divemaster training. Prerequisites: PADI 200 or equivalent training and PADI 350 or equivalent First Aid/CPR. Minimum Age: 12

PADI 310 - Deep Diver

The PADI Deep Diver course is designed to provide the diver with the necessary skills and knowledge for safe diving in the 60 – 130 feet range. Planning, problems, hazards, decompression, special equipment, buoyancy control, descent lines, emergency procedures, flying after diving, dive tables, and recompression chambers will be covered. Prerequisites: PADI 200 or equivalent training. Minimum Age: 15

PADI 320 - Wreck Diver

The PADI Wreck Diver course is designed to provide the diver with the necessary skills and knowledge for safe wreck diving. This course covers the planning, organization, procedures, techniques, problems, and hazards associated with wreck diving and limited penetration. Prerequisites: PADI 200 or equivalent training. Minimum Age: 15

PADI 330 - Search and Recovery Diver

The PADI Search, and Recovery course is designed to acquaint the diver with the techniques and applications of search and recovery methods. This course covers planning, organization, procedures, techniques, and problems and hazards associated with search and recovery. Prerequisites: PADI 200 or equivalent training. Minimum Age: 12

PADI 350 - Emergency First Response/DAN FA Pro

The PADI Emergency First Responder/DAN First Aid for Professionals course is designed to teach Basic Life Support (BLS) CPR and rescue breathing at the layperson level, automated external defibrillator (AED) use (optional), preventing and caring for shock, spinal injury management, use of barriers to reduce disease transmission risk, and basic first aid and first aid kit considerations Prerequisite: None

PADI 360 – Event Management

Organization, planning, and accountability for dive travel. Includes learning how to interface well with store staff and boat crews. Procedures to facilitate an enjoyable time for the dive travel participants. Additionally, learn how to design a nonprofit, community outreach Scuba event, including the preparation, advertising, and event management during the event. Prerequisite: None

PADI 370 – Public Safety Diver Trainer I

The Public Safety Diver Trainer I course is conducted to gain experience with the tools you are acquiring in the PSD program. The individual taking this course has a high level of personal diving skill and is increasing their knowledge of public safety diving situations, including recoveries of bodies, cars, and other recoverable items. Prerequisite: PADI 400.

PADI 371 – Public Safety Diver Trainer II

The Public Safety Diver Trainer II course is conducted to gain experience with the tools you are acquiring in the PSD program. The individual taking this course has a high level of personal diving skill and is increasing their knowledge of public safety diving situations, including recoveries of bodies, cars, and other recoverable items. Prerequisite: PADI 400.

PADI 373 – Public Safety Diver Trainer IV

The Public Safety Diver Trainer IV course is conducted to gain experience with the tools you are acquiring in the PSD program. The individual taking this course has a high level of personal diving skill and is increasing their knowledge of public safety diving situations, including recoveries of bodies, cars, and other recoverable items. Prerequisite: PADI 400.

PADI 374 – Public Safety Diver Trainer V

The Public Safety Diver Trainer V course is conducted to gain experience with the tools you are acquiring in the PSD program. The individual taking this course has a high level of personal diving skill and is increasing their knowledge of public safety diving situations, including recoveries of bodies, cars, and other recoverable items. Prerequisite: PADI 400.

PADI 400/500 Series

PADI 400 - Public Safety Diver

The PADI Public Safety Diver is designed to familiarize the diver with public safety diving skills, knowledge, planning, organization, procedures, techniques, and hazards. You will learn the different equipment requirements for Public Safety Diving and different search patterns, scene handling, communication procedures, witness handling, and victim and self-rescue techniques. Prerequisite: PADI 300; PADI 500

PADI 401 Public Safety Search & Recovery Diver

The Public Safety Search and Recovery Diver is designed to familiarize the diver with the skills, knowledge, planning, organization, procedures, techniques, and hazards of public safety Search and Recovery diving. You will learn the different equipment requirements for Public Safety Diving and different search patterns, lifting techniques, hazards, and problem management. Prerequisite: PADI 330

PADI 402 Public Safety Diver Surface Support Specialist

The Public Safety Diver Surface Support Specialist is introduced to and becomes familiar with special procedures, equipment, scene handling, communication procedures, basic public safety diving search and rescue techniques, emergency procedures, and documentation requirements. Prerequisite: PADI 400

PADI 403 Public Safety Rescue Diver

The Public Safety Rescue Diver is a review of standard dive rescue practices followed by potential rescue concerns more specific to the public safety diver. You will learn the different equipment requirements for Public Safety Rescue Diving and assist at the surface, advanced entanglement and entrapment rescue techniques, hazards, and problem management. Prerequisite: PADI 400

PADI 404 Public Safety Underwater Investigator

The Public Safety Underwater Investigator Diver develops advanced investigative skills to include witness interviews, scene assessment and protection, interpretation of collected information, search & recovery techniques, appropriate removal techniques, and report writing. Prerequisite: PADI 400

PADI 405 Public Safety Underwater Evidence Recovery Specialist

The Public Safety Underwater Evidence Recovery Specialist provides advanced evidence recovery and preservation techniques. Topics include various packaging methods, grid patterns, and collection of small evidence and proper sieve use techniques Prerequisite: PADI 400

PADI 406 Public Safety Underwater Body Recovery Specialist

The Public Safety Underwater Body Recovery Specialist concentrates on various body recovery techniques, including body bagging both underwater and on the surface and using litters and lift bags for weighted bodies. Topics include various packaging methods, search and recovery techniques, witness interview interpretation, and interaction with family members. Prerequisite: PADI 400

PADI 407 Public Safety Underwater Vehicle Recovery Specialist

The Public Safety Underwater Vehicle Recovery Specialist concentrates on vehicle recovery techniques, including lift/attachment points, and works with wreckers and cranes. Topics include vehicle surveys, vehicle and scene surveys, potential hazards including entanglement and entrapment, and environmental concerns. Prerequisite: PADI 400

PADI 408 Public Safety Underwater Metal Detector Specialist

The Public Safety Underwater Metal Detector Specialist the use of underwater metal detectors in public safety diving. Topics include selecting components and proper use of underwater metal detectors both on land and underwater, use of various search patterns, and proper recovery of located items. Prerequisite: PADI 400

PADI 409 Master Public Safety Diver

The Master Public Safety Diver is a culmination of all the courses. Students will have the opportunity to apply and demonstrate the various components of their public safety diving education, culminating in a successful public safety dive operation. Prerequisite: PADI 400; PADI 403-407

PADI 410 - Scientific Diver – Distinctive Specialty

The PADI Scientific Diver is a distinctive specialty that teaches students how to apply their fish and algae identification skills towards collecting data to answer scientific questions. Students learn basic techniques of quadrat surveys, transect surveys, fish identification surveys, and algal surveys for research purposes. Prerequisite: PADI 300

PADI 411 Instrumentation

The Instrumentation course is directly related to PADI 410 as basic survey tools will be constructed. Additional information on physical instrumentation to be used and deployed, such as Acoustic Doppler Current Profilers (ADCPs), thermistors, and conductivity recorders, will be used as needed for research. Prerequisite: PADI 100

PADI 413 Basic Statistics

The Basic Statistics course is geared to introduce new students to experimental design and statistical analysis concepts. Data acquired during the PADI 410 course is analyzed statistically and presented in oral and written form. Prerequisite: PADI 410

PADI 414 Data Visualization

The Data Visualization course is used to introduce new students to the different data visualization techniques employed in the oceanographic community. Basic techniques include bar graphs, time series plots, contour plots, and pie charts to interpret data collected in PADI 410. Prerequisite: PADI 410

PADI 415 Basic Oceanography

The Basic Oceanography course provides entry-level information about the core components of Oceanography: Biological, Geological, Chemical, and Physical. Students learn the major physical drivers of circulation in their local area and the pertinent biology, chemistry, and geology, and the interactions between them. Prerequisite: PADI 100

PADI 416 Scientific Diver Training

The Scientific Diver Training allows the divers to collect data as necessary for the research project. Diving will be supervised, and instructors will provide advice as required. Prerequisite: PADI 400

PADI 451 - PADI Divemaster Prep I

The First Dive Master Prep course increases the students' knowledge professional communication, public speaking. In addition the student is introduced to techniques for dive site management and assisting divers. Prerequisite: minimum age 18

PADI 452 - PADI Divemaster Prep II

The Dive Master Prep course increases the students' knowledge in dive theory, physics and equipment. The student learns techniques for dive site management and assisting divers. Students receive significant training in assisting instructors during PADI 100 Open Water courses working towards assuming a role of responsibility for the welfare of other divers in their charge. Prerequisite: minimum age 18

PADI 453 - PADI Divemaster Prep III

The Dive Master Prep course increases the students' knowledge in dive theory, physics and equipment. The student learns techniques for dive site management and assisting divers. Students receive significant training in assisting instructors during PADI 100 Open Water courses working towards assuming a role of responsibility for the welfare of other divers in their charge. Prerequisite: minimum age 18

PADI 454 - PADI Divemaster Prep IV

The Dive Master Prep course increases the students' knowledge in dive theory, physics and equipment. The student learns techniques for dive site management and assisting divers. Students receive significant training in assisting instructors during advanced dive training activities working towards assuming a role of responsibility for the welfare of other divers in their charge. Prerequisite: minimum age 18

PADI 455 - PADI Divemaster Prep V

The Dive Master Prep course increases the students' knowledge in dive theory, physics and equipment. The student learns techniques for dive site management and assisting divers. Students receive significant training in assisting instructors during advanced dive training activities working towards assuming a role of responsibility for the welfare of other divers in their charge. Prerequisite: minimum age 18

PADI 456 - PADI Divemaster Prep VI

The Dive Master Prep course increases the students' knowledge in dive theory, physics and equipment. The student learns techniques for dive site management and assisting divers. Students receive significant training in assisting instructors during advanced dive training activities working towards assuming a role of responsibility for the welfare of other divers in their charge. Prerequisite: minimum age 18

PADI 500 - PADI Divemaster Course

The Dive Master course is conducted on an individual basis and denotes an individual who has a high level of personal diving skill, has instructor-level knowledge of diving theory, has had significant training in assisting instructors during training activities, and can assume a role of responsibility for the welfare of other divers in their charge. Prerequisite: PADI 300, PADI 455 and 40 dives, minimum age 18

PADI 600 Series

PADI 601 – Apprentice Teaching I

The Apprentice Teaching course is conducted before the enrollment in the IDC and lets participants hone their teaching abilities. Participants teach or aid with teaching the Open Water diver course under the supervision of an authorized to teach PADI instructor. Participants lead lectures, present skills, and conduct Confined and Open Water dives. Prerequisite: PADI 500 and complete set of DDC required equipment.

PADI 602 – Apprentice Teaching II

The Apprentice Teaching course is conducted before the enrollment in the IDC and lets participants hone their teaching abilities. Participants teach or aid with teaching the Open Water diver course under the supervision of an authorized to teach PADI instructor. Participants lead lectures, present skills, and conduct Confined and Open Water dives. Prerequisite: PADI 500 and complete set of DDC required equipment.

PADI 603 – Apprentice Teaching III

The Apprentice Teaching course is conducted before the enrollment in the IDC and lets participants hone their teaching abilities. Participants teach or aid with teaching courses authorized for an OWSI under the supervision of an authorized to teach PADI instructor. Participants lead lectures, present skills, and conduct Confined and Open Water dives authorized for an OWSI. This course focuses on the rescue diver course, the Open Water Diver course day three, and the Advanced Open Water course. Prerequisite: PADI 500 and complete set of DDC required equipment.

PADI 604 – Apprentice Teaching IV

The Apprentice Teaching course is conducted before the enrollment in the IDC and lets participants hone their teaching abilities. Participants teach or aid with teaching courses authorized for an OWSI under the supervision of an authorized to teach PADI instructor. Participants lead lectures, present skills, and conduct Confined and Open Water dives authorized for an OWSI. This course focuses on the Rescue Diver and the Open Water Diver course day four. Prerequisite: PADI 500 and complete set of DDC required equipment.

PADI 605 – Apprentice Teaching V

The Apprentice Teaching course is conducted before the enrollment in the IDC and lets participants hone their teaching abilities. Participants teach or aid with teaching courses authorized for an OWSI under the supervision of an authorized to teach PADI instructor. Participants lead lectures, present skills, and conduct Confined and Open Water dives authorized for an OWSI. This course focuses on the Rescue Diver course and the risk management associated with teaching Scuba diving. Prerequisite: PADI 500 and complete set of DDC required equipment.

PADI 606 – Apprentice Teaching VI

The Apprentice Teaching course is conducted before the enrollment in the IDC and lets participants hone their teaching abilities. Participants teach or aid with teaching courses authorized for an OWSI under the supervision of an authorized to teach PADI instructor. Participants lead lectures, present skills, and conduct Confined and Open Water dives authorized for an OWSI. This course focuses on the Divemaster course. Prerequisite: PADI 500 and complete set of DDC required equipment.

PADI 607 – Apprentice Teaching VII

The Apprentice Teaching course is conducted before the enrollment in the IDC and lets participants hone their teaching abilities. Participants teach or aid with teaching courses authorized for an OWSI under the supervision of an authorized to teach PADI instructor. Participants lead lectures, present skills, and conduct Confined and Open Water dives authorized for an OWSI. Prerequisite: PADI 500 and complete set of DDC required equipment.

PADI 608 – Apprentice Teaching VIII

The Apprentice Teaching course is conducted before the enrollment in the IDC and lets participants hone their teaching abilities. Participants teach or aid with teaching courses authorized for an OWSI under the supervision of an authorized to teach PADI instructor. Participants lead lectures, present skills, and conduct Confined and Open Water dives authorized for an OWSI. Prerequisite: PADI 500 and complete set of DDC required equipment.

PADI 610 Regulator Servicing

Students learn the inter working of the 1st and 2nd stage of SCUBA regulators. Students are introduced to the different types of regulators and how balanced and unbalanced regulators operate. Prerequisite: None

PADI 620 Risk Management

Learn a proficient method of recordkeeping, ensuring proper tracking of training and experience. Includes a round table discussion of diving safety issues and proper responses. Prerequisite: None

PADI 630 Boat Handling and Crewing

Practical seamanship on a dive boat that provides regular dive charters. Learn how to assist and guide inexperienced and experienced divers. Includes anchoring and evaluating dive conditions, including currents and visibility affecting divers and stressing diver safety. Prerequisite: PADI 500

PADI 650 Scuba Cylinder Filling and Visual Inspection

Learn the basics of filling Scuba cylinders from a multi-bank filling station. Includes hooking the cylinder up to the filling station, verifying tank pressure, checking cylinder for current VIP and Hydro status. Additionally, students learn the regulations and fundamentals of conducting visual inspections of solid wall and composite SCUBA and SCBA cylinders. Prerequisite: None

PADI 660 Scuba Retail Sales

Selling the basic Scuba equipment to divers includes salesman etiquette, equipment features, benefits presentation, closing the sale, and countering objections. Prerequisite: None

PADI 700 Series

PADI 701 - PADI Instructor Development Course I

The PADI Instructor Development Course (IDC) is the heart of the PADI Instructor training process. During the IDC, qualified PADI Divemasters or Assistant Instructors will apply their diving skills and knowledge to learn how to teach the PADI system in the classroom, confined water (pool), and open water. This section covers teaching in confined water, general PADI standards, risk management, and basic dive theory. Prerequisites: PADI 500

PADI 702 - PADI Instructor Development Course II

The PADI Instructor Development Course (IDC) is the heart of the PADI Instructor training process. During the IDC, qualified PADI Divemasters or Assistant Instructors will apply their diving skills and knowledge to learn how to teach the PADI system in the classroom, confined water (pool), and open water. This section covers how to teach the Open Water Course, Adventures in Diving, Rescue, and Divemaster courses. Confined water presentations are also part of this module. Prerequisites: PADI 701

PADI 703 - PADI Instructor Development Course III

The PADI Instructor Development Course (IDC) is the heart of the PADI Instructor training process. During the IDC, qualified PADI Divemasters or Assistant Instructors will apply their diving skills and knowledge to learn how to teach the PADI system in the classroom, confined water (pool), and open water. This section covers confined water presentations, a Discover Scuba diving workshop, and exams are given. Prerequisites: PADI 702 or certification as an assistant instructor.

PADI 720 Emergency First Response /DAN FA Pro Instructor

Gain experience in how to structure learning, the requirements of performancebased training, and your role as the instructor in the learning environment for teaching CPR and first aid. You also learn how to motivate students, evaluate student knowledge, present course content effectively, becomes proficient in developing students' hands-on skills practice sessions, and are taught how to present an effective scenario-based learning experience. Prerequisite: PADI 350

PADI 730 – Instructor Exam

Two-day PADI Open Water Instructor exam. Prerequisite: PADI 701-703, PADI 720

PADI 800 Series

PADI 800 Deep Diver Specialty Instructor

The PADI Deep Diver course is designed to provide the diver with the necessary skills and knowledge for safe diving in the 60–130 feet range. Planning, problems, hazards, decompression, special equipment, buoyancy control, descent lines, emergency procedures, flying after diving, dive tables, and recompression chambers will be covered. Students will obtain the Deep Diver certification card and then perform 16 additional dives using the knowledge and skills attained in the course. Prerequisite: PADI OWSI or equivalent

PADI 810 Digital Underwater Photography Specialty Instructor

The Underwater Photography course is designed to provide the diver with the necessary skills and knowledge for taking underwater pictures with both a digital camera and a more conventional film camera. You will learn how to choose the right underwater camera system, apply the PADI SEA method to get great shots quickly, and three primary principles for good underwater photos. Students will obtain the Underwater Photography certification card and then perform 16 additional dives using the knowledge and skills attained in the course. Prerequisite: PADI OWSI or equivalent

PADI 820 Enriched Air Diver Specialty Instructor

This course is designed to give diving the necessary skills and knowledge and teach Enriched Air Nitrox. The student will develop a working knowledge of Enriched Air Nitrox, physiological aspects of breathing oxygen at elevated partial pressures, computation of equivalent air depths, use of dive tables, oxygen analysis, dive planning, and special equipment requirements. Enriched Air dives will be combined with the required dives for other specialties. Prerequisite: PADI OWSI or equivalent

PADI 830 Night Diver Specialty Instructor

The PADI Night Diver Specialty Instructor course is designed to acquaint the diver with the techniques and applications of Night diving and how to teach them to divers. Specifically, students will learn night dive planning, organization, procedures, techniques, potential problems, buoyancy control, entries, ext, underwater navigation at night, and an introduction to the nocturnal aquatic life. Students will obtain the Night Diver certification card and then perform 16 additional dives using the knowledge and skills attained in the course. Prerequisite: PADI OWSI or equivalent

PADI 835 Underwater Navigator Diver Specialty Instructor

The PADI Underwater Navigator Diver Specialty Instructor course is designed to acquaint the diver with the techniques and applications of navigating underwater and how to teach them to divers. Specifically, students will learn navigation dive planning, organization, procedures, techniques, potential problems, buoyancy control, entries, ext, Students will obtain the Underwater Navigation Diver certification card and then perform 16 additional dives using the knowledge and skills attained in the course. Prerequisite: PADI OWSI or equivalent

PADI 840 Search and Recovery Diver Specialty Instructor

The PADI Search, and Recovery course is designed to acquaint the diver with the techniques and applications of search and recovery methods. This course covers planning, organization, procedures, techniques, and problems and hazards associated with search and recovery diving. Students will learn how to prepare the Search and Recovery teaching tools and to present the material in addition to acquiring the required 20 dives. Prerequisite: PADI OWSI or equivalent

PADI 845 – Diver Propulsion Vehicle (DPV) Instructor

The PADI Diver Propulsion Vehicle course is designed to acquaint the diver with the skills and knowledge for the safe operation of a DPV and teach those skills to divers. This course covers planning, organization techniques and problems associated with the operation of a DPV. Students will obtain the PADI 113 DPV specialty and log experience dives using the skills obtained in the specialty course. Prerequisites: PADI OWSI or equivalent.

PADI 850 Sidemount Diver Specialty Instructor

The PADI Sidemount Diver Instructor course is designed to acquaint the diver with the techniques and applications of different way to configure your cylinders. This course covers planning, organization, procedures, techniques, and problems and hazards associated with sidemount diving. Students will learn how to prepare the Sidemount teaching tools and to present the material in addition to acquiring the required 20 dives. Prerequisite: PADI OWSI or equivalent

PADI 860 Lion Fish Specialty Instructor

The Underwater Hunter course is designed to provide the diver with the necessary skills and knowledge for hunting edible fish species by various methods such as pole spear and speargun. You will learn how to choose the right hunting tool, bag the catch, protect your catch in the water, identify edible species, follow local laws and legislation, certification card, and then perform 16 additional dives using the knowledge and skills attained in the course. Prerequisite: PADI OWSI or equivalent

PADI 870 Wreck Diver Specialty Instructor

The PADI Wreck Diver Instructor Specialty course is designed to provide the diver with the necessary skills and knowledge for safe wreck diving and teach those skills to divers. This course covers planning, organization, procedures, techniques, problems, and hazards associated with wreck diving and limited penetration. Upon completing the Wreck Diver Specialty, students are required to log 16 more wreck dives using the skills obtained in the Wreck Diver specialty. Prerequisite: PADI OWSI or equivalent

PADI 880 Drysuit Diver Specialty Instructor

The PADI Drysuit Diver Instructor Specialty course is designed to provide the diver with the necessary skills and knowledge for safe drysuit diving and teach those skills to new divers. This course covers planning, organization, procedures, techniques, problems, and hazards associated with drysuit diving. Upon completing the Drysuit Diver Specialty, students are required to log 19 more wreck dives using the skills obtained in the Drysuit Diver specialty. Prerequisite: PADI OWSI or equivalent

PADI 890 Full-Face Mask Diver Specialty Instructor

The PADI Full-Face Mask Diver Instructor Specialty course is designed to provide the diver with the necessary skills and knowledge for diving safely with a full-face mask and teach those skills to new divers. This course covers planning, organization, procedures, techniques, problems, and hazards associated with diving with a fullface mask. Upon completing the Full-Face Mask Diver Specialty, students are required to log 19 more dives using the skills obtained in the Full-Face Mask Diver specialty. Prerequisite: PADI OWSI or equivalent

PADI 900 Series

PADI 900 PADI IDC Staff Instructor

The PADI IDC Staff Instructor allows the dive professional to participate in the development of Open Water Scuba Instructors. Participants learn about the Instructor Development Course (IDC) process and assist a Course Director in IDCs. Prerequisite: PADI MSDT

PADI 901 Divemaster Mentoring

The PADI Divemaster Mentoring program introduces the candidate to the PADI divemaster testing process, paperwork, and filing procedures. Candidates directly mentor potential divemasters through the dive theory development process and appropriate student interaction as dive professionals. Prerequisite: PADI MSDT

PADI 902 Rescue Techniques

The PADI Rescue Techniques course prepares candidates to teach the proper Rescue Techniques for the PADI 300 Rescue Diver course. Prerequisite: PADI OWSI

PADI 903 Course Design & Marketing

Candidates design and prepare their Scuba specialty to submit to PADI for approval. Candidates learn marketing techniques from webpage design and setup, email marketing, and Scuba club interaction. Prerequisite: PADI OWSI

PADI 904 EFR Instructor Trainer

Candidates learn the teaching methodologies of teaching an EFR First Aid/CPR course. Participants will also learn how to market their program and acquire clients. Prerequisite: PADI OWSI

PADI 905 IDC Seminars

Assist with all portions of Instructor development, including organization, facility rental, scheduling, and paperwork submission. Prerequisite: PADI 900 and PADI 904

PADI 906 Master Instructor

The second-highest ranking of a PADI professional allows participants to assist with all portions of Instructor development, including organization, mentoring, facility rental, scheduling, and paperwork submission. Prerequisite: PADI 900 and PADI 904

PADI 1000 -1900 Series

PADI 1000 Tec40 Diver

The PADI Tec 40 qualifies a diver to complete up to 10min of non-accelerated decompression while breathing from one additional deco cylinder of up to EANx50. Depth is limited to 130 ft or 40 m. Prerequisite: PADI 200, PADI 210, PADI 310 or proof of 10 dives to 100ft, 30 dives using Enriched Air, seven deeper than 100'

PADI 1050 Tec45 Diver

The PADI Tec 45 qualifies a diver to complete dives with longer decompression schedules and an additional deco cylinder. The diver is qualified to complete accelerated decompression dives using any mix of EANx or oxygen. Depth is limited to 45m/ 145 ft. Prerequisite: PADI 1000; PADI 300; 50 dives, 12 using Enriched Air deeper than 60 ft and at least six deeper than 100ft

PADI 1100 Tec50 Diver

The PADI Tec 50 diver is qualified to use air for bottom gas. Two decompression mixes up to 100% Oxygen to make extended, accelerated decompression dives. The depth limit is 50 m/ 165 ft. Prerequisite: PADI 200; PADI 310 or equivalent; PADI 1100; 100 dives, 20 using Enriched Air deeper than 60 ft and at least 15 deeper than 100 ft.

PADI 1150 Tec Gas Blender

PADI 1150 Tec Gas Blender course develops the skills and knowledge to blend Nitrox and Trimix gases and understand the different blending methodologies. It also explains the potential hazards of handling oxygen and demonstrates the steps related to oxygen cleaning equipment. Prerequisite: PADI 210

PADI 1250 Advanced Wreck Diver

The PADI Advanced Wreck Diver course is a distinctive specialty designed to provide the diver with the necessary skills and knowledge for safe wreck diving at deeper depths. This course covers the planning, organization, procedures, techniques, problems, and hazards associated with wreck diving at deeper depths. Prerequisites: PADI 200, PADI 1000 or equivalent training.

PADI 1300 Tec40 CCR Diver

The PADI Rebreather course teaches divers how Type T rebreathers (electronic CCRs or manual CCRs) work and the importance of proper setup and maintenance. Divers will work on performing proper predive checks, developing the habit of keeping the loop closed when the mouthpiece is not in your mouth, doing bubble checks, bailout drills and handling other potential problems, buoyancy fine-tuning, gauge monitoring, and post-dive procedures and disassembly. Prerequisite: PADI 200; PADI 210; PADI 300; PADI 310 or proof of 10 dives to 100ft; 30 dives of which ten using Enriched Air; At least 50 dives.

PADI 1350 Tec60 CCR Diver

The second level of technical dive training with Type T CCRs. Extend your CCR diving to a maximum depth of 60m/200 ft. Complete multiple decompression stops, manage life-support problems, and dive with trimix/heliox as a diluent. Prerequisite: PADI 1300 Tec40 CCR Diver; 150 dives, with at least 25 dives and 50 hrs experience diving the Type T CCR with an offboard bailout system. 10 CCRD dives deeper than 30m/100 ft.

PADI 1400 Self-Reliant Diver

The PADI Self-Reliant Diver Specialty course develops the skill and knowledge required for self-reliance and independence while diving. Students develop the skills of planning and carrying out dives without a partner. Prerequisite: PADI 200, minimum age 18.

PADI 1450 Tec Trimix Diver

The PADI Tec Trimix diver is qualified to use air, EANx, oxygen, and trimix for multiple stop decompression dives using two or more decompression gases and to dive to depths of 90m/300 ft using hypoxic trimix. Prerequisite: PADI 300; PADI 1100 50; 150 dives

NOTICE TO STUDENTS: ACCET COMPLAINT PROCEDURE

This institution is recognized by the Accrediting Council for Continuing Education & Training (ACCET) as meeting and maintaining certain standards of quality.  - a) Name and location of the ACCET institution;
 - b) A detailed description of the alleged problem(s);
 - c) The approximate date(s) that the problem(s) occurred;
 - d) The names and titles/positions of all individual(s) involved in the problem(s), including faculty, staff, and/or other students;
 - e) What was previously done to resolve the complaint, along with evidence demonstrating that the institution's complaint procedure was followed prior to contacting ACCET;
 - f) The name, email address, telephone number, and mailing address of the complainant. If the complainant specifically requests that anonymity be maintained, ACCET will not reveal his or her name to the institution involved; and
 - g) The status of the complainant with the institution (e.g. current student, former student, etc.).
- 3. In addition to the letter of complaint, copies of any relevant supporting documentation should be forwarded to ACCET (e.g. student's enrollment agreement, syllabus or course outline, correspondence between the student and the institution).
